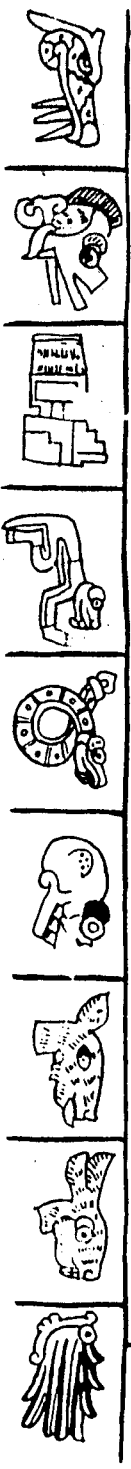

Project SWEETT (Southeastern Wisconsin Excellence in Education Through Teacher Training Project) will provide tuition scholarships to selected qualified applicants who are committed to completing the professional education program leading to licensure in bilingual education or teaching English as a second language.

**How SWEETT it is!**

If you:

- ✓ are committed to becoming a bilingual or ESL teacher.
- ✓ are a graduating high school senior, or
  - have a high school diploma, GED, or the equivalent, or
  - have undergraduate college credit, or
  - have a college degree, but are not certified to teach.
- ✓ demonstrate proficiency in English and one of the following languages: Spanish, Hmong, Vietnamese, Cambodian, Thai, Laotian, or another language spoken by language minority students in your local school district.
